Our Graduated Response for Learners:

- ✓ Identification of children/young people requiring SEND Support and initiation of “assess, plan, do, review” cycle.
- ✓ Consideration of application for Education, Health and Care Plan.
- ✓ All children/young people identified as requiring SEND Support, or with an Education, Health and Care Plan are on our Record of Need.

How we identify children/young people that need additional or different provision:

- ✓ Class teacher refers to SENCO – completes Cause for Concern form.
- ✓ Ongoing curriculum assessments
- ✓ Tracking progress using data



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- ✓ Further assessments by specialists, including those from external agencies

We take a holistic approach by all aspects of a child's development and well-being. Our pastoral support arrangements for supporting the emotional and social development of all children/young people, including those with SEND, is set out in our School Offer. The Assess, Plan, Do, Review Cycle:

For children/young people on our Record of Need, an Assess, Plan, Do, Review cycle was established by the SENCo in partnership with the child/young person, their parents and the class teacher. Please see our SEND Policy for further details.

This year, provision made for children/young people on our SEN Register/Record of Need has been:

- ✓ Communication and Interaction – 30 pupils
- ✓ Cognition and Learning – 26 pupils
- ✓ Social, Emotional and Mental Health – 25 pupils
- ✓ Sensory and/or Physical Needs – 3 pupils

During the 2024/25 academic year, we had 69 Children/young people receiving SEN Support and 10 children/young people with Education, Health and Care Plans.

We monitored the quality of SEND provision by tracking progress using a series of methods to gather relevant data, including:

- regular observation of teaching by the SENCO, Head and subject leaders



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- tracking of children's work, including children with SEND
- monitoring by the SEND governor
- maintenance of records of reading and spelling ages, National Curriculum levels and Engagement levels that illustrate progress over time
- My Plan review meetings termly
- regular meetings between the SENCO and class teachers

Partnerships with other schools and how we manage transitions:

We have worked with a number of schools in the area in the following ways:

- ✓ Transition to Year 6 with Tewkesbury Academy and other Secondary Schools
- ✓ Visits to schools where our children will be moving to (to meet with their staff and share information)
- ✓ SENDCo to SENDCo telephone calls/emails to previous/next school



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This year, 1 child/young person requiring SEN Support and 1 child/young person with Education, Health and Care Plans joined us from other schools.

2 child/young person on our Record of Need in 2024/2025 made a successful move to other schools. This included 9 pupils moving onto their secondary education.

We supported the transition from our Pre-School and other local nurseries into our Reception class by telephone conversations between our Reception teacher and the Pre-School/Nursery staff transition records are provided by, New Starter Welcome evening for parents, two Stay and Play sessions in July with a transition booklet and story booklet emailed home. In September, there will be one to one parent's meetings, which are longer if the child has SEN.

The transition from Year 6 to secondary school has been supported through transition days and conversations between the SENDCo/class teachers of both schools.

Parents were included in this process through My Plan meetings, email/telephone contact and general SEN meetings.

Ongoing development:

We work hard to ensure that any areas of support for our learners that can be improved are identified and that strategies are put in place to make those improvements.
